

PHOENIX STUDIO AWARD 2026



The Phoenix Studio Award offers one year of support through rent-free studio space and other opportunities, to artists from under-represented groups and who experience intersecting forms of discrimination.

Developed in response to the need for affordable workspaces, the award aims to help artists to connect in a supportive studio environment. We want to facilitate creative possibilities, risk-taking, experimentation and exchange. As a Studio Award holder, the artist will be part of the wider network of artists at Phoenix Art Space.

The award has been established to celebrate talent, individuality, and original thinking within contemporary art practice. It aims to increase and strengthen equitable representation and amplify artistic voices from underrepresented groups to fully reflect the diversity of Brighton and Hove's population.

As a charity, one of our purposes is to promote equality and diversity in the arts. We aim to fulfil this objective by providing exhibition and studio space to those in need because of their age, race, gender, disability, sexual orientation or financial hardship.

In order to assess eligibility for this award, we need to gather certain information from you, some of which is sensitive. Our aim is to further our charitable objectives and your responses will allow us to review your application. The Award will be allocated based on talent and need. The applications will be reviewed by a selection panel. We aim to give feedback to any artist requesting it.

The one-year programme of support includes:

Studio Space

A rent-free workspace at Phoenix Art Space (central Brighton) for one year. Starting in March 2026, the studio has 24-hour access. **Please note the studio access is via stairs with no available lift.**

Opportunities

- Taking part in the annual Open Studios in May, providing access to local and national arts audiences
- A studio Visit with Phoenix Executive Director
- A Window Gallery Exhibition to conclude the time spent in the studio and present the body of work produced (if appropriate)
- A Q&A session as part of the Window Gallery exhibition opening
- Promotion on our website

Support

Phoenix Art Space has an Access Fund, with which to support our Studio Award holder (e.g. BSL interpretation costs, contribution to the cost of a personal carer). Please note that specific access needs should be outlined in your application. We appreciate that this can change and we are open to adapting to what you might need over the course of the year.

Our Studio Manager works at Phoenix Art Space two days/week on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings and all day Friday, and provides support to all of our artists and award holders, regarding the management of their studios.
